CIUS professors honoured with 2012 Antonovych award

15 February 2013—Two professors of the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies, University of Alberta, Drs. Zenon Kohut and Frank Sysyn, have been honoured with the Antonovych award for 2012 during a ceremony held 10 November 2012 at the Embassy of Ukraine in Washington, D.C. Dr. Kohut received his award "for his contribution to the study of Cossack Ukraine," and Dr. Sysyn "for his contribution to scholarship in Ukraine."

Dr. Martha Bohachevsky-Chomiak, chair of the award jury, noted that the research work of both scholars has challenged the dominant Polish and Russian interpretations of the early modern period and established "that modern Ukraine has deep roots as a historic nation. Their research and scholarly work has influenced the whole range of Slavic and East European studies."

The Antonovych Foundation was established in 1980 by the prominent philanthropists Omelan and Dr. Tatiana Antonovych of Washington in support of Ukrainian studies and Ukrainian literature. To date there have been sixty-five recipients of the Antonovych award, among them many prominent writers, scholars, politicians, and dissidents, including non-Ukrainians (David Saunders, Robert Conquest, and Zbigniew Brzezinski).



Skills for Employment Project announced

SIAST partners with UCC-SPC to enhance business training in Ukraine

The Saskatchewan Institute of Applied Science and Technology announced on March 9, 2013 that it had been awarded a \$3.4-million project in Ukraine funded by the Canadian International Development Agency. The Skills for Employment Project will enhance business programming in selected schools in Kyiv, Lviv and Ivano-Frankivsk.

UCC-SPC will assist SIAST with the recruitment and selection of volunteers to help with specific initiatives related to the project both in Canada and in Ukraine.

The announcement was made at a luncheon for approximately 65 participants of UCC-SPC's Annual General Meeting, and Workshop for Translators and Interpreters in Saskatoon. Speakers were: Brad Trost, MP for Saskatoon-Humboldt on behalf of CIDA/ Federal Government; Hon. Don Morgan, Minister of Advanced Education, Government of Saskatchewan; Slawko Kindrachuk, President of UCC-SPC: and, Dave Harvey. SIAST Associate Vice-President, Business Development and Advancement.

Over the next three years, the project will transfer Canadian know-how and experience in developing relevant labour market training to support medium and small enterprise devel-

opment. It is tailored to the needs of participating communities and skills training institutions, providing better services to students and entrepreneurs.

"The Ukraine project will pay special attention to ensuring that existing and newly established training programs are open and accessible to a wide range of equity and special needs groups, particularly women and youth," says Dr. Larry Rosia, SIAST president and CEO. B

Celebrating Taras Shevchenko

2014 will mark the 200th Anniversary of the birth of Ukraine's bard, Taras Shevchenko. Planning is now underway for events in Saskatchewan that will commemorate this important event in the history of the Ukrainian people.

The Ukrainian Canadian Foundation of Taras Shevchenko has announced that it will be providing special funding in support of Shevchenko commemoration-related projects. Details of this unique opportunity are available on the Foundation's web site at www.shevchenkofoundation.com/grant-programs.html.

Taras Shevchenko was born on March 9, 1814 into a Ukrainian serf family in Moryntsi, Kyiv Gubernia (Russian

Empire). He was orphaned at the age of eleven. Under the mentorship of the village cantor, his genius qualities were recognized early. Shevchenko excelled both academically as well as in art and painting. Those talents were noticed by Pavel Engelhardt who took him to Vilnius and then St. Petersburg where he formally

studied art. In 1838, the proceeds gained from a special art commission were utilized to buy Shevchenko's freedom from serfdom. He continued to draw and paint for the next decade, winning several major awards in the Russian Empire.

Shevchenko's artistic talent extended to writing poetry, which he wrote in the colloquial Ukrainian even though the

Russian rulers considered it inferior. He did this to draw attention to the importance of the Ukrainian language and culture as a self-identification trait of Ukrainians against the policies of Tsarist Russia.

His best-known work is a collection of poems entitled *Kobzar*. Published in 1804, Kobzar became a great success due to its "clarity, breadth and elegance of artistic expression not previously known in Ukrainian literature" (Ivan Franko).

While living in St. Petersburg, Shevchenko never forgot about his Ukraine. During his 1845 trip to Ukraine, Shevchenko befriended prominent Ukrainian intellectuals and joined the Brotherhood of Sts. Cyril and Methodius. This secret political organization aspired to liberate Ukraine. In 1847 the Brotherhood was suppressed by Russian authorities and Shevchenko was arrested. During a search of his belongings, his poem Son (The Dream), which criticized Russian Imperial rule in Ukraine, was discovered. Shevchenko was imprisoned and exiled to Orenburg (near the Ural Mountains). Although the Tsar decreed that "he was not to write or paint and to be placed under the strictest surveillance," Taras Shevchenko continued to find ways to be creative as an artist and poet. Finally in 1857 he was freed but it was not until May 1859 that he was allowed to move back to his Ukrainian homeland. This lasted only a couple months as an accusation of blasphemy resulted in Shevchenko being ordered to St. Petersburg, never to see his Ukraine again.

Shevchenko's exile and imprisonment took a great toll on his health. He passed away on 10 March 1861 in St. Petersburg the day after his 47th birthday. That spring, in May, he was finally laid to rest atop a hill on the banks of the Dnipro River near Kaniv in his beloved Ukraine.

Taras Shevchenko's works and life are revered and honoured by Ukrainians throughout the world. His impact on Ukrainian literature was immense and he is called the father of the modern Ukrainian language. His work contributed immensely to the development of a Ukrainian national consciousness.

Celebrating Achievement in Ukrainian Dance

The culmination of the dance season is now underway for the province's Ukrainian dance schools. Dancers from across the province have been participating in the numerous dance festival-competitions taking place in the Battlefords, Lloydminster, Prince Albert, Regina, Saskatoon, and Yorkton. These will be followed by year-end concerts and, for some, summer tours to Ukraine, the USA or elsewhere. Congratula-

UCC-SPC elects Board at Annual General Meeting

Three-year strategic plan presented

Thirty delegates and guests attended UCC-SPC's Annual General Meeting and Board Elections at the Park Town Hotel in Saskatoon on March 9, 2013.

Following a call to order and opening greetings from UCC-SPC President Slawko Kindrachuk, Director at Large Cathy Schabel was elected to chair the proceedings. Opening prayer was led by Albert Kachkowski, from the Ukrainian National Association Mykola Lysenko Branch #444, followed by a moment of silence for all members of the community who had passed away in the last year.

President Slawko Kindrachuk presented his report, paying particular attention to UCC-SPC's recently developed strategic plan for the next three years.

"In 2011, I committed to working with our Board, Executive Director and Staff to develop a strategic plan, which focused upon developing and implementing a focused marketing and communication plan, a targeted fund-raising and volunteer recruitment plan, and a branch and community development plan," said Kindrachuk.

"It is my pleasure to report that such a strategic plan has been developed, adopted and is presented in this annual report," he continued. "Thank you to everyone who participated in the five community consultations and in the board/staff retreat."

He finished his presentation by acknowledging the contribu-



tion of Danvlo Puderak, who marked his tenth year with UCC-SPC, and long-time employee Ihor Kodak.

UCC-SPC Treasurer Matt Petrow summarized the audited report, which indicated UCC-SPC's healthy financial status. Total revenue rose by 4% over 2011 and was up 10% from 2010, mainly due to increases from SaskCulture/SaskLotteries Trust and the Ministry of the Economy in support of UCC-SPC's Immigration Settlement services.

Petrow said there is strong funding from SaskLotteries, which

is "at the highest levels since the 1990s."

Expenditures are also up as a result of rent and building costs. "This is normal as inflation takes effect," he said. "It is also a consequence of the rapid increase in rental rates in the city of Saskatoon, which became most evident following UCC-SPC's move to a new office location in 2011."

UCC-SPC experienced a surplus of \$30,635 in 2012 which has been directed to its Contingency Fund. The Fund now stands at slightly more than \$173,000.

"Another emerging trend is that donations are not as high as in the past," Petrow said.

UCC-SPC is taking steps to offset this trend by focusing on other types of fundraising and additional funding sources. The annual 50-50 lottery raised more than \$9,000 last year for the Community Development Fund. This helped the grant program award a record \$31,000 in grants in support of the Saskatchewan's Ukrainian cultural community.

In his report, UCC-SPC Executive Director opened with an overview of the organization's vision. He then described the process, and outlined the priorities and seven directions of the "strategic plan that is to guide us for the next three years."

The plan highlights "areas that are to receive particular focus in addition to UCC-SPC's current programs and services," he

"We are an umbrella—an organization of organizations," Puderak continued. "We are as strong as our member organizations. We want to assist them with financial development and capacity."

Puderak then touched on the quarterly publication Visnyk, the Community Development Fund granting program, Immigration Settlement, and Translation & Interpretation Services,

which are among the most active programs of UCC-SPC.

Commenting on the area of immigration, Puderak indicated that "the vast majority are economic immigrants, who arrive through the Saskatchewan Immigrant Nominee Program which has no specific language requirement. It is the employer that determines whether applicants have sufficient knowledge of English to carry out their work responsibilities."

Since it has been found that "settlement and integration is better when immigrants have knowledge of English, the UCC-SPC Immigration Committee will promote that newcomers improve their knowledge of English before they come to Canada."

The Executive Reports were followed by the Board Elections. UCC-SPC Directors are elected by members to serve a twoyear term. Directors may only serve a maximum three consecutive terms in any one position.

Paul Kardynal, Chair of UCC-SPC's Nominating Committee, presented the slate of candidates, which was unanimously approved by the eligible delegates.

As neither was able to attend, Kindrachuk presented mementos of appreciation to the new PA Veselka Club President Diane Bazowski (for Elmer) and UCC-SPC Vice-President MaryAnn Trischuk (for Merle). In accepting and thanking on Merle's behalf, Trischuk said that Merle "has been instrumental in keeping the branch going and has been a wealth of knowledge."

Prior to the conclusion of the meeting, Cecilia Kachkowski announced the Taras Shevchenko concert being presented the next day, March 10, by the Saskatoon Branch of the UCC. She also said that the branch had established a planning committee in preparation for a major celebration in 2014 on the occasion of the 200th anniversary of Shevchenko's birth.



- the quality and effectiveness of business training programs offered by partner skills training institutions;
- school partnerships with industry and the community in order to improve the responsiveness of training programs thereby leading to higher

employment and self-employment of their male and female graduates.

The project aims to enhance business programming in the selected schools through: the development of stronger and mutually beneficial relationships between govern-

ment, community and private sector stakeholders; new teaching resources; curricula review; and, training of trainers. College instructors will participate in professional development training and upgrading; new training courses will be developed; and supporting training resources will be produced.

In this way, the new training programs will yield graduates better capable of succeeding in Ukraine's growing private sector-led economy and labour market. More market-relevant business training

programs means that more new businesses will open, existing enterprises will have a local source of skilled human resources, communities will develop more sound and diversified economies, and local governments will have more diversified tax revenues to sustain social programming.

Host institution overseas

Three colleges in Ukraine were selected to participate in this project based upon: their prominent roles in the regional/local economies; the quality of their business programming; their capacity to implement joint projects; and the recommendation of the Ukrainian Ministry of Education and Science, Youth and Sport. They are:

- Anton Makarenko Industrial-Pedagogical College (Kyiv)
- Lviv Restaurant Service and Tourism Higher Vocational School (Lviv)
- Ivano-Frankivsk Hotel Service and Tourism Higher Vocational School (Ivano-Frankivsk)

ACTIVITIES FOR YOUR CHILD

This article describes various opportunities for your child to develop various skills through programs offered by government agencies and community organizations.

У цьому номері «Вісника» мова йтиме про наше майбутнє, про найдорожчий скарб — про дітей. У процесі інтеграції у нове суспільство дуже важливо не забути про те, що цей процес є складним не лише для дорослих, але й для дітей. Хоча в більшості випадків діти, на відміну від дорослих, скоріше вивчають нову мову та набувають друзів, все ж варто пам'ятати, що батьки є відповідальними за виховання дітей та створення умов, які впливатимуть на їх розвиток.

Багато українців нової хвилі сподіваються на те, що вся навчально-виховна та позашкільна робота, пов'язана з розвитком їхніх дітей, буде базуватися у школі, так, як це було колись в Україні: спортивні секції, гуртки художньої самодіяльності та інше. Ні, панове, це не так. Позашкільне виховання дітей у Канаді — це відповідальність батьків. Саме батьки мусять реєструвати дітей у ті чи інші гуртки та секції, після довгої робочої днини відвозити їх на заняття (у більшості випадків платні), бути присутніми на спортивних змаганнях чи концертних виступах, а також працювати волонтерами під час організації цих заходів. Усе це суттєво впливає на наш розклад. З іншого ж боку, бути свідком та учасником формування особистості та всестороннього розвитку вашої дитини — це незрівнянна втіха.

Існують безкоштовні програми позашкільної діяльності, фінансовані державними та громадськими організаціями. До них належать такі: кадети повітряних або військовоморських сил, піхотних військ (air cadets, navy cadets, army cadets), пластуни (scouts), дівчата-лідери (girl guides). Ці програми спрямовані на розвиток фізичних здібностей, лідерських навичок, громадянської свідомості та самоповаги. Програми кадетів розраховані на підлітків віком від 12 років і дають чудову можливість поєднання розваг та

Last December, Yevshan's artistic Director Vitali Sorokotiaguine and two senior dancers, Luba Wojcichowsky and Shawn Heinz, provided a workshop for Ukrainian dancers who live in the Parkland area. The workshop was hosted in the Yorkton Regional High School. A minimal fee was charged to dancers to cover the rental of the facility and other costs were absorbed by Yevshan.

Yevshan believes that all dancers should be exposed to various types of instruction and ballet. We understand that some areas of the province lack resources or the qualified instructors to introduce certain aspects of Ukrainian dance. The workshop emphasized ballet barre, centre exercises, spinning and corner exercises and also touched on dances from various regions of Ukraine. The participants came out of this workshop learning the style and steps of traditional Ukrainian dance.

Eighteen Ukrainian dancers from various schools registered for the workshop. Dancers from Norquay, Saskatoon,



Yorkton, Kamsack and Manitoba (Russell, Benito, Swan River, Brandon) attended. Some Manitoba dancers missed out as the roads to Yorkton on the morning of the workshop were treacherous. We definitely will provide a workshop again and we hope that these dancers can attend.

Vitali and the senior dancers had a very positive response to this workshop.

"The workshop was very well organized and the instructors were very encouraging,

were clear with their directions and modelling, and I felt like I could follow the instructions. They were also very welcoming and were positive about helping us when we made mistakes (sometimes a few times over). I really, really enjoyed the workshop and liked getting out of my element/comfort zone and learning dance from regions we hadn't really covered before. Overall, I would absolutely attend another workshop and I would encourage more of our dancers to come as well."

We would like to thank everyone who participated in this workshop and we encourage every dancer who attended and is thinking of moving to the city of Saskatoon for school or work to come and visit our studio.

Western Canadian universities connecting with Ukraine

With initiative from the Canada-Ukraine Centre Inc. (CUC) based in Saskatoon, five western Canadian universities from Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba are engaging in collaboration in agriculture, energy and health sciences with a number of Ukrainian universities located both in western and eastern Ukraine.

The Universities of Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba, as well as Grant MacEwan University in Edmonton, have established the Prairie Agriculture Universities in Ukraine Consortium and are actively developing collaborative agreements that will feature student and faculty exchanges, joint research, and professional development. The Ukrainian universities involved include the Kyiv National University of Life and Environmental Sciences, the Lviv National Agrarian University, the Sumy National Agrarian University, the Dnipropetrovsk State Agrarian University and the Kharkiv National Technical University in Agriculture. Following a mission to Ukraine in February 2012 by the Prairie Agriculture Universities in Ukraine Consortium, an assistant professor of food processing at the Kharkiv National Technical University of Agriculture began, in September 2012, a one-year, post-doctoral fellowship at the College of Agriculture and Bioresources at the University of Saskatchewan.

The University of Regina has conducted an internship program with the Ivano-Frankivsk National University of Oil

and Gas for the past 11 years. On the average, four to five Ivano-Frankivsk National University students majoring in engineering, environmental sciences and business studies spend three months in Regina working with organizations such as SaskPower, the Petroleum Technical Research Centre and Prairie Adaptive Research Collaboration. After the completion of their internship at the University of Regina, a number of the students from Ukraine have returned to the U of R for graduate studies.

On October 31, 2012 the University of Saskatchewan hosted an Interprovincial Symposium on Health Projects with Ukraine.

Participants included representatives from the University of Alberta, the University of Saskatchewan, Grant MacEwan University, the University of Ottawa and the World Health Organization representative in Kyiv, Ukraine via webx. A number of potential areas of collaboration with Ukraine were discussed, particularly in tuberculosis, asthma and hypertension. In addition the University of Manitoba is conducting a pilot study, funded by UNICEF, in the city of Zaphorizhia, Ukraine on HIV/AIDS prevention amongst the adolescent and youth population.

CUC is working with the above Canadian and Ukrainian universities in an organizational and coordinating role. In addition CUC has undertaken other projects in international business as well as assisting the City of Lviv, Ukraine in obtaining UNESCO heritage status and identifying Ukrainian developed technologies suitable for commercialization in Canada.

Holodomor Educator's Conference

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the Holodomor, Famine-Genocide in Ukraine. Educators and interested individuals from across Canada and the USA will be gathering at an important forum to discuss a tremendously complex and challenging subject of great importance to our community this spring.

A conference dealing with the Holodomor and its inclusion in school curricula is taking place May-12, 2013 at St. Vladimir Institute in Toronto. Entitled The Holodomor and Curricula — Triumphs and Challenges, the conference is designed to allow participants to broaden their knowledge about inclusion of the Holodomor into curricula and to review the most recent pedagogy, resources and teaching materials in the realm of Holodomor studies. Above all, the conference is an opportunity for educators to exchange knowledge and experience.

The conference is being organized by the Holodomor Research and Education Consortium (Toronto) and the National Holodomor Education Committee of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress, with the support of the Ukrainian Canadian Research and Documentation Centre and St. Vladimir Institute in Toronto.

HREC is a new initiative of the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies of the University of Alberta.



Convention planning committee chairperson Cecilia Kachkowski is enthusiastic about hosting the convention in Saskatoon. "The goal of our committee is to welcome our delegates and make the convention experience in Saskatoon as positive an experience as possible," she said. "The USRL was founded in Saskatoon and we look forward to hosting everyone here for the 58th Convention." B
